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### **Remote Learning Summary for Parents/Carers**

Dear parents/carers,

As you may be aware, we are now required to provide remote learning for those children who have to self-isolate due to covid-19 symptoms, being in close contact with someone who has tested positive, or has tested positive themselves. Please find below a summary of the procedure that we will follow within our school. You can find the full remote learning policy on the school website which gives more detail on the expectations of parents, pupils and staff working in school or at home.

Your child will come home with an exercise book to record their learning in should they need to complete some of their learning at home. In some cases this will be the exercise book they have been using to complete homework in. They will also be given a list of log in details for their online learning platforms including RMEasimaths, Accelerated Reader (if they have an Accelerated Reader account), ActiveLearn and Lexia (if they a Lexia account). There will be some tasks on the weekly timetable that you will be required to hand in to the class teacher. This can be either be handed in at the end of the isolation period for feedback or photographed/ scanned and emailed to the class teacher.

#### **Setting work:**

If your child is required to learn from home, you will be sent a home learning timetable via parent email for your child to complete at home which will include any learning resources required. This email will also include the name and email address of a nominated staff member that you can contact for further support with the work that has been set.

#### **Providing feedback on work:**

- Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via email.
- Teachers will email back feedback if required and should respond to any emails from parents/children within 48 hours. This will be on the same day if the whole class bubble is self-isolating.

#### **Keeping in touch with pupils and parents:**

- You should expect to receive a welfare call from a staff member around the middle of the self-isolation period to speak to the parent and child when convenient. This can be more often upon prior arrangement.

#### **Staff can expect pupils learning remotely to:**

- Be contactable during the hours of the school day 9am – 3pm (Monday to Friday) – although they may not always be in front of a device the entire time.
- Seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants (during school hours).
- Alert teachers if they're not able to complete work.

#### **Staff can expect parents with children learning remotely to:**

- Make the school aware if their child is sick or otherwise can't complete work.
- Seek help from the school if they need it.
- Encourage their child to complete home learning.

At this point, we have made the decision as a school not to deliver any online lessons or communication through video platforms such as zoom or Microsoft teams as we feel that this puts further pressure on parents to facilitate time specific technology time and it would also contravene many of the safeguarding policies we have in place.

If you feel that your child is unable to complete learning from home using technology, a paper-based learning pack is available from school however we cannot guarantee that this will match the classroom learning planned and it will be your responsibility as a parent to arrange the collection of this as soon as possible. Staff in school do not have the capacity to deliver these packs to homes.

Due to the new legislation in place, it is expected that your child will complete the work and return it to school. This can either be photographed and emailed or sent back at the end of the self-isolation period. Please see the weekly timetable for tasks that need to be returned to the teacher. Whilst we are very aware that home learning cannot replace the quality first teaching that the children will receive in the classroom, it is imperative that the children continue with learning in this form at home to ensure that there are no further unnecessary delays in their progress given that they have already missed a lot of school earlier in the year. We kindly ask that you support us with this as much as possible.
