

Pupil Premium Impact Report 2014-15

What is Pupil Premium?

The pupil premium is a government initiative that targets extra money at pupils from deprived backgrounds. Research shows that pupils from deprived backgrounds underachieve compared to their non-deprived peers. The premium is provided to enable these pupils to be supported to reach their potential.

The Government has used pupils entitled to free school meals (FSM), looked after children and service children as indicators of deprivation, and have provided a fixed amount of money for schools per pupil based on the number of pupils registered for FSM over a rolling six year period. This is known as 'Ever 6' - these are the pupils for which we will be aiming to close the gap.

How do we spend pupil premium?

In the financial year 2014-15 our allocation of Pupil Premium Funding was £119 600.

The funding was spent in the following ways:

- Bespoke interventions run by Teaching Assistants and Higher Level Teaching Assistants.
- Boosting Reading Potential interventions.
- An ECAR teacher to close the gap for individuals in reading.
- 1:1 and group interventions in maths.
- 1:1 class room support for individuals in Year 2, Year 4 and Year 6.
- Providing a free Breakfast Club.
- Enrichment activities eg. Top up funding for residential visits.
