

# **PUPIL PREMIUM REPORT 2016-17 FINANCIAL YEAR**

## **OVERVIEW:**

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011, and paid by means of a specific grant per child based for pupils registered as eligible for FSM in Reception to Year 11 and for looked after children. The Pupil Premium was calculated using data returns taken during the School Census. Since April 2012, eligibility for the Pupil Premium has also been extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 Free School Meals measure). A premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

The Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding and it will be used to address any underlying inequalities for children eligible by ensuring that funding reaches the pupils who need it most.

## **OBJECTIVES FOR PUPIL PREMIUM IN THIS SCHOOL:**

1. To provide additional educational support to accelerate the progress and raise the standard of attainment for these pupils.
2. To close the gap between the attainment of these pupils and their peers where it exists.
3. To address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others, as far as the school's powers allow.
4. To enable the schools and families to work together to improve the progress of children eligible for Pupil Premium.
5. To allow pupils to thrive in their social and emotional development.

## **SCHOOL POLICY:**

The Headteacher and Governing Body have agreed a policy for Pupil Premium to guide the use of funds and to ensure that it represents value for money.

## **ACCOUNTABILITY:**

The Headteacher and SLT (Senior Leadership Team) will regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies we have put into place for Pupil Premium and report to the governing body on its progress and impact.

- In the 2016-17 financial year, the school received **£93,000** additional Pupil Premium funds.

In July a summary of evidence from the evaluation of the impact of the funding will be provided.

*If you believe that your child is entitled to Free School Meals, but you are not currently claiming them then the school will not be given Pupil Premium funding to spend on your child.*

*Cheshire East awards free school meals to families that receive the qualifying incomes as follows, and whose children attend a Cheshire East school: Income support (IS); Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA); Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA(IR); support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999; Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs) that does not exceed £16,190; The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit. If you have recently become unemployed or have reduced your working hours and have been granted the four week working tax credits run on, then you may be entitled to free school meals.
